In our annual report Governors share with you the achievements of the school, its staff and students. We have had another good year, where we have felt confident enough to invite a number of experts to come in and discuss and challenge us on the progress we are making. This served us well when Ofsted then inspected both our residential service in February and the school in April and found us to be good in both inspections and outstanding in the way we help and protect resident young people.

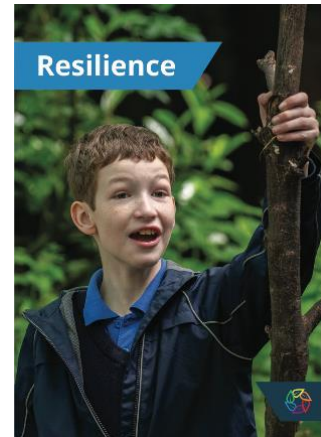
But what drives us on is not so much the evaluation we receive from Ofsted (although that is useful) but the feedback we receive from our parents and students, and this year you have been really generous with your positive views of our school which helps us to look forward and plan confidently. Our students are also represented by George and Lucy who come along to Governors' meetings to tell us what is going well and what can be improved. Acting on their representations we've made a number of changes including to the toilets and school dinners and have provided residential students with their own budget to personalise their space. Our students have been actively involved in the design of the new bathrooms too. So it's a partnership between all of us that we are celebrating at the end of this year!

Student Assessment, Progress and 6th Form

6th Form students have been working with their teachers on creating the space in which they will learn and have been picking up new skills along the way. They have decorated a room in the main building where they meet, plan and take time out. Their design is very striking and impressive, so do take a look if you have time. They are also working on the Gatehouse, upcycling furniture as well. We plan to open a small café there that they can staff, with a hairdressing salon upstairs, and a shop selling products they will make or grow. This will be the beginning of our ambition to share our site with others, bringing our local community in to visit as well as our visits out to meet them.




Our teachers have also begun to develop a folder for each student that provides the evidence of the progress they are making during the year towards their targets. You will begin to see these at their annual reviews, and we hope that they will provide you with the ability to question and understand the progress your child is making.

Governors have continued the discussion with SLT about how we can understand the way students are assessed and then track their progress, and we are now seeing some impressive spider charts for individual students showing where they are on 7 aspects of Words for Living and 8 aspects of Numbers for Life. This will give us a good evidence base on which to gain assurance of the progress that each student is making. Soshana Austin, Steve Forder and Chris Allan have worked closely during the year to achieve all these things and their progress has been impressive too!



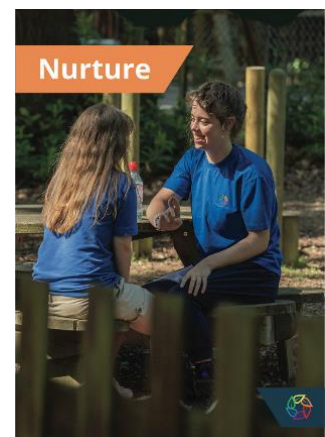
Staff changes

So, we are delighted that Cathryn Falconer and Jacqui Tovey have agreed to join us to job share the interim role until our new Head joins us for the academic year 2019/20. Jacqui and Cathryn have a long history of working successfully together leading a Cooperative Special Needs School in Kent, and are already getting to know our school and its senior team as they prepare for their arrival next term



About the student roll

We have continued to experience a sharp increase in applications for places at Parkwood Hall this year, but are regrettably having to turn away a significant number of requests as we cannot accommodate them within the current class structure. The table below shows the trend since we converted to a Co-operative Academy.

We made parents a promise last year that we would not grow further without a consultation with you on your views. So recently many of you completed a parental survey where some questions asked your opinion on the pupil size of our school. 60% of respondents were happy with the size of the school and its growth, 10% felt the growth had been bad for their child but 30% felt that the growth had been positively good.

During the summer holiday period we have plans to improve the infrastructure of the school to support the growing numbers which will create 8 much improved private bathrooms for our residential students in the main buildings, as well as improving and increasing the number of staff and visitor toilets, and developing more and safer parking spaces in the overflow carpark by providing a hard surface and capacity for lighting there. We were very pleased to give our students the chance to get involved in developing the plans for their private bathrooms which they did with their usual enthusiasm.



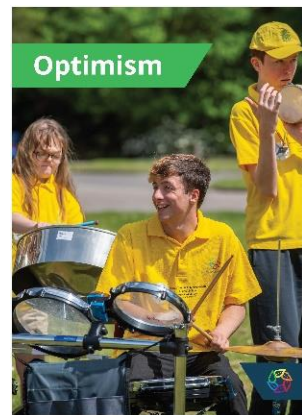
Governors' Plans

Governors have asked John O'Connor of the Schools Cooperative to advise us on developing a strategy for the school that includes further growth as well as using our beautiful site fully and sharing it more widely for public benefit. John met with Governors in June and will report back this month. Meanwhile we have asked Jo Nyland to begin the

work of identifying architects who can help us to assess the potential of our site and buildings and then begin the process of developing a longer-term plan for the growth of the school and/or its activities. We will continue to consult you along the way of this exciting journey.

We have also been fully supportive of Nick in bringing in Nick Hind, a school improvement consultant, to work with the leadership team on how to evidence more strongly the progress that our students make. The new data that we are beginning to receive as a result helps Governors to ask better questions of our Senior Leadership Team when we meet with them. We want to build on and develop this focus with our interim heads and so will continue to buy in the services of the consultant for the next term to support them as they move into leadership here.

We have been pleased to see the development of the extended day and flexible boarding this year and now have 10 students doing after school activities, 5 students on an extended day and 6 students using the flexible boarding offer. We are working with the senior leadership team to develop a proposal to put to staff that should provide greater continuity of staff across the service offer. At our last meeting we agreed a proposal to create more senior teaching assistant posts in our class rooms to provide continuity of teaching when our teachers are out of the classroom. We are confident that this will assist us in seeing our students progress faster in the new academic year in developing and practicing new skills.
